E-Waste Recycling Event – Saturday, October 20 Safely Dispose Broken & Obsolete Consumer Electronics

The City of Dacono and Genesis Electronics Recycling, Inc. are teaming up on Saturday, October 20th for a 1-day electronics recycling (e-waste) event. From 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. at Dacono City Hall, you can recycle nearly all your e-waste for free. If you have old, broken, or obsolete computers, monitors, printers, some appliances, cell phones, washer/dryer, TVs, VCRs or any other electronic device that unusable- this is your day! Even though a majority of the recycling services are free of charge, there are small charges associated with certain items such as CRT monitors with a fee of \$7.00, and old tube TVs under 32" \$10.00 and 32" or greater \$20.00. Also, the fee of \$7.00 will apply for the Certified Hard Drive Destruction. Certificate of Destruction is a legal document provided to a customer after the destruction is completed. Genesis Electronics Recycling, Inc. is a leading edge electronic recycler that operates in 2 different states, Illinois and Colorado. Clerk Certifies Election Ballot Voters to Decide on Mayor, Council

The City Clerk certified the municipal election ballot for the November 6 general election. Nominating petitions submitted for the office of Mayor included Charles Sigman and Sandra Tucker. Nominating petitions certified for the two city council seats were Michael Ayres and Geneiveve Schneider. Current City Councilmember Lori Saine is not running for re-election in the City of Dacono. The City has an intergovernmental agreement with [Weld County](#) for a coordinated election and city hall be an official vote center on November 6th.

2012 Presidential Election Information

To participate in the 2012 Weld County Presidential Election, Weld County Voters have 3 options:

- **VOTE BY MAIL.** Ballots will be mailed out on October 15th.
- **VOTE EARLY.** Five Early Vote Centers will be open October 22nd – November 2nd, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- **VOTE ON ELECTION DAY.** Tuesday, November 6th - 33 Vote Centers will be open 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Winter Weather is Coming.....eventually

City Follows Adopted Snow Response Plan

The 90+ degree temperature days have passed and soon snow will be on the way. The City follows an adopted snow response plan when responding to winter weather snow events. Snow is generally plowed to the side of the street. Center snow banks create melt/freeze, sight distance and emergency vehicle access problems. Glen Creighton Drive is the exception to this approach. Snow is plowed to the center and the center snow bank is removed during major storms as time and resources permit. Where possible, on Second



Street, Forest Avenue and Colorado Boulevard, snow is plowed to just one side. Due to limited personnel, equipment, and materials, snow removal service is not provided on every residential street. Sidewalks must be cleared of snow by the property owner within 48 hours of the end of a snow storm. 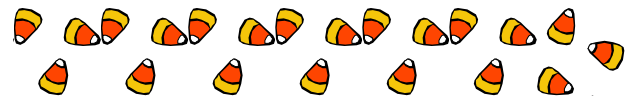

Halloween Safety Tips

Helpful Tips for a Freaky Fun and Safe Halloween!

- Swords, knives, and similar costumes accessories should be short, soft & flexible..
- **A**void trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with an adult.
- **F**asten reflective tape to costumes & bags to help drivers see you.
- **E**xamine all treats for choking hazards & tampering before eating them.
- **H**old a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see & others see you.
- **A**lways **W-A-L-K-** and don't run from house to house.
- **L**ook both ways before crossing the street; use established crosswalks.
- **L**ook for non-toxic Halloween make-up.
- **O**nly walk on sidewalk whenever possible or on the far edge of the road facing traffic.
- **W**ear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls.
- **E**at only factory wrapped-treats.
- **E**nter home only if you are with a trusted adult.
- **N**ever walk near lit candles or luminaries.
