Daylight Savings Begins March 10

Spring Forward 1 hour

Longer days are around the corner. Daylight savings begins at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 10. Be sure to move your clock 1-hour forward. This is also a great time to change the batteries in your smoke alarms and test all CO2 detectors. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) recommends that you replace batteries annually and test the alarms every month.
